- Evidence-based research, prevention and treatment are important for our work.
- Seamless, on-demand access to a full continuum of prevention, intervention and treatment services is necessary, including reaching underrepresented and underserved populations.
- Medication-Assisted Treatment, which is supported by scientific evidence, is key to treating opioid use disorder.
- Recovery and wellness are most effective when services include an individual's family, community and/or social networks.
- Developing the healthcare workforce is needed to meet increasing prevention and treatment needs.
